## **Comparing Military Ranks in World War II**

Maybe it's never been a problem for you. But when I read histories or novels about World War II I'm frequently confused when I see some military officer referred to as an "Obergruppenführer," for example, or a "Wing Commander." I'm American, and as a history buff I'm familiar with the ranks in the United States armed forces. But to what levels of command do those terms refer? And I discovered when I searched the Internet for some translation tool that there was none to be found.

So, I scraped up information here and there on the web. The following table is the result. It's *slightly* oversimplified. For example, in the Nazis' *Waffen-SS*—the combat arm of the *Schutzstaffel* headed by *Reichsführer* Heinrich Himmler—the rank of *Oberführer* has no precise correspondent in the fighting forces of other combatants. It's slightly higher than a colonel in the US or UK armies but slightly lower than a brigadier general. And the *Reichsführer* himself was not an officer in the *Waffen-SS*, since he ran the SS as a whole.
